The Constabulary is responding to an increase in incidents of targeted burglaries within the Asian community, committed by organised crime groups. Crime prevention advice is being issued and officers are providing a highly visible presence to deter criminals. Cross-border teamwork has led to a number of arrests, some thought to be linked to Cheshire incidents, and extensive investigations locally and regionally are ongoing...
